## Industrialization & Global Integration, 1750-1900

- **Between 1750 and 1900**, the world's geography was **defined by technology and colonialism**.
- Technologies of **transportation and communication, trade, venture capital, and migration** created the **world's first global civilization** and fueled the **competition for and acquisition of empires**.
- Centers of industry such as the vast Canadian-American complex around the Great Lakes and the Ruhr of Germany became critical.
- To facilitate trade and military power, **canals** were dug between seas and oceans.
